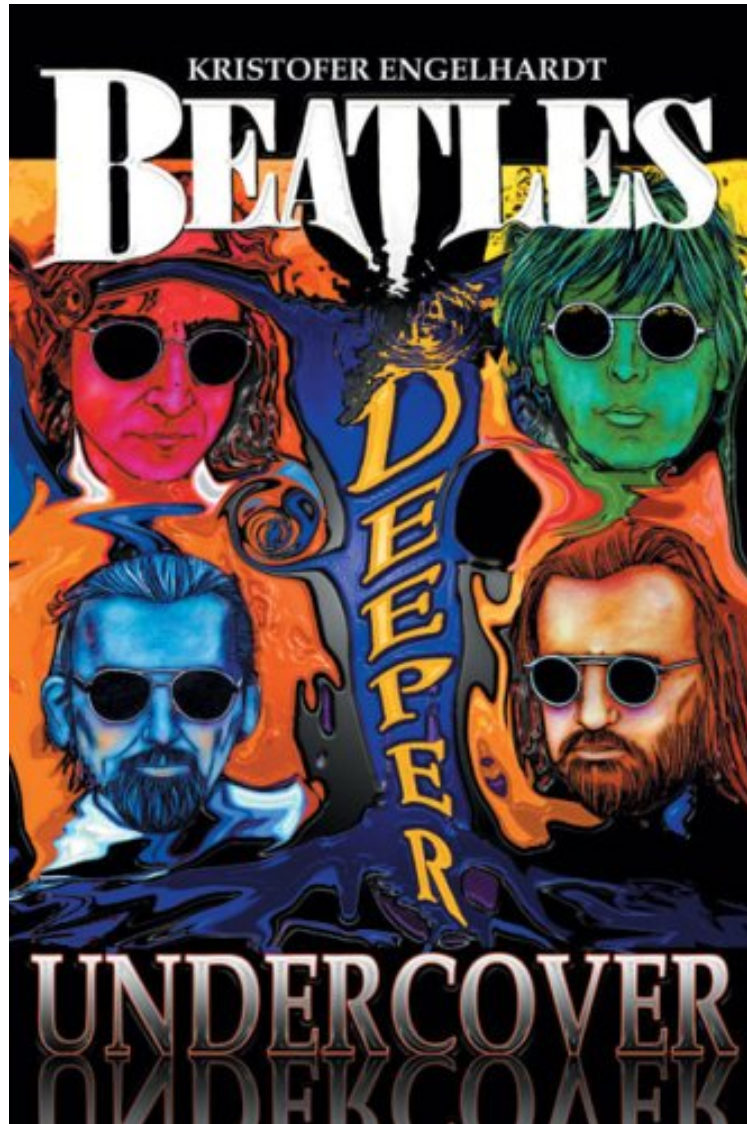

The book is very interesting but it isn't what you may think. The author did a fantastic job of chronicling the guest work of the Beatles on many things. But I think that the book has a lot of entries that are reaching and prove to be annoying and filling the book with unnecessary detail that muddy it up. A lot of the book uses Ringo's All Star Band to create entries that I don't

think fit in. Ringo has had many members of this band over the years but I don't think that they count in this list per se. So if there is a bootleg somewhere of, let's say, the band's appearance in Chicago, he will list them as an appearance for each member. So if you do the math, this fills up a lot of the book. I would rather keep it to only appearances he made on their official recordings, if any. I also would leave out the appearances on award shows and the RRHOF. There are also a lot of listings of "unauthorized releases" (ie bootlegs) which are very interesting. The illustrations are mainly pictures of the author with the various artists covered in the book, and some letters too. Although cool I think it is more him showing off and it adds to the book's annoyance factor after a while.
