Challenging Puzzles -- from my nephew that used the book By Original Flatlander "The Black Belt Ken Ken book is a challenging puzzle book and is level 4 in the 4 belt series of white, green, brown, and black belt. After solving all 4 books (all 1200 puzzles), I have to say the Black Belt book is pretty darn good. My only complaint is that since it carries a very similar format to the brown belt book more or less,

solving strategies at times became pretty repetitive, but otherwise I really enjoyed the 2nd half of the book where you not only had to guess the numbers, but the maths between the numbers, and that element really takes the dynamics of the puzzles to a whole new level, thus making those 150 puzzles extremely entertaining. I took a several month hiatus when one of the puzzles combined with more pressing matters made me take a break from ken ken, but I came back at full throttle and finally solved the black belt book. In my opinion, most of the puzzles in the book, even the ones where you had to guess the maths, were not really that much harder than the brown belt puzzles, in fact many of them were ironically easier than the brown belt puzzles, there were a few notable challenges in the black belt book, but none of the puzzles were really aggravating, I think it gets great marks in general. If you're reading this review Tetsuya Miyamoto, if you do a 2nd degree Martial Arts Ken Ken series, I would really enjoy it if with all 6 standard sizes of Ken Ken (4x4 to 9x9) each had puzzles with and without maths indicators, that would really make a great 2nd degree Ken Ken series. You don't have to do the 2nd degree series right away, but that's just my idea once you do. In general, I really liked all 4 belts of difficulty as they gave me all kinds of variety and solving dynamics. I give the series a 94 out of 100 in general. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Great book. Hard puzzles. By FDI like puzzles. I like really hard puzzles. These are really hard. The most difficult 9x9 Sudoku puzzles rarely take me more than 20 minutes to solve. Each of these puzzles takes me hours. There are 300 puzzles, 2 per page. The top puzzle on each page is 8x8, the bottom is 9x9. The first half of the book includes operations, but the last 150 puzzles don't (meaning each box does not tell you if it is multiplication, division, addition, or subtraction). Do NOT get this book if you want an introduction to Ken Ken or a primer that lets you build up to the more challenging puzzles.
