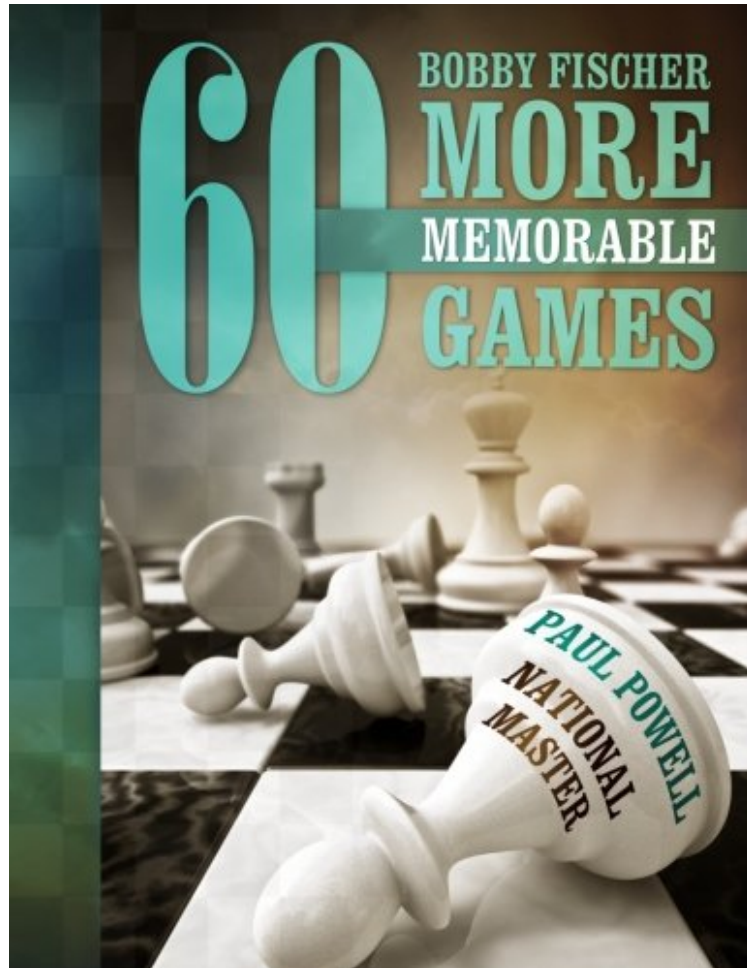

I know that expecting it to be on par with Fischer's own "My 60 Memorable Games" is asking too much. I was hoping that it would be on par with Soltis' book "Re-discovering Bobby Fischer." With the exception of some of Fischer's early games, the majority of the games in this book are fairly well known. The author does demonstrate basic strategies and tactics in his analysis of each game so players rated 1500 USCF and below can benefit. Each game is lightly annotated and very easy to follow. In fact, this book feels like a book written for beginner/advance beginner Chess players. If you are a beginner Chess player wanting to improve, then this book is for you. If you are an intermediate or advance player, then you're better
