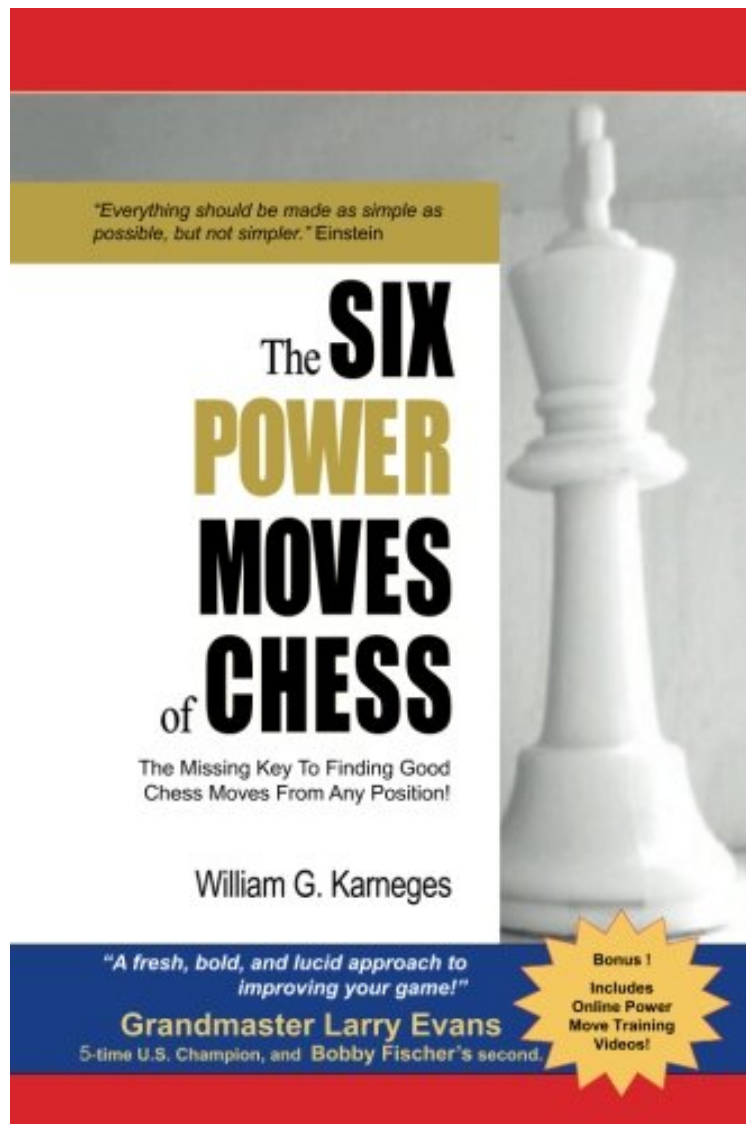

Is it targeted for beginners? Probably not. Is it targeted to players from 1200 to 1600 USCF? Probably. There are some very interesting ideas and tips propounded in the book. There is also alot of the usual material that should be familiar (both strategic and tactical). What suprised me most, is that the author is only 1850 USCF. This compares with the Improve Your Chess At Any Age book, written by a 2000 player. If the system works so well, why the low rating? The book may help a player select moves in certain positions. If you are looking for some novel ideas, you might give this book a try.
