They also use "s" where we often use "z", as in organisation. The answers are all in the back, in block form, unlike some books, in which the answers are across the bottom and numbered rather peculiarly. If you like Codewords, overall, you will most likely enjoy this one.

Compelling and addictive, Codeword is the cracking alternative to Su Dokus and Crosswords. The concept is simple. Each number represents a letter, so, starting with the solved letters, use your logic and vocabulary to reveal more letters, form words, and then crack the code! The Codeword series is so popular because you don't need any prior knowledge, unlike a crossword. You can just pick up a pen and get puzzling. It steadily increases your vocabulary, as the difficulty slowly grows as you progress through the book, and even though you'll be working your brain, it's the perfect way to unwind.
