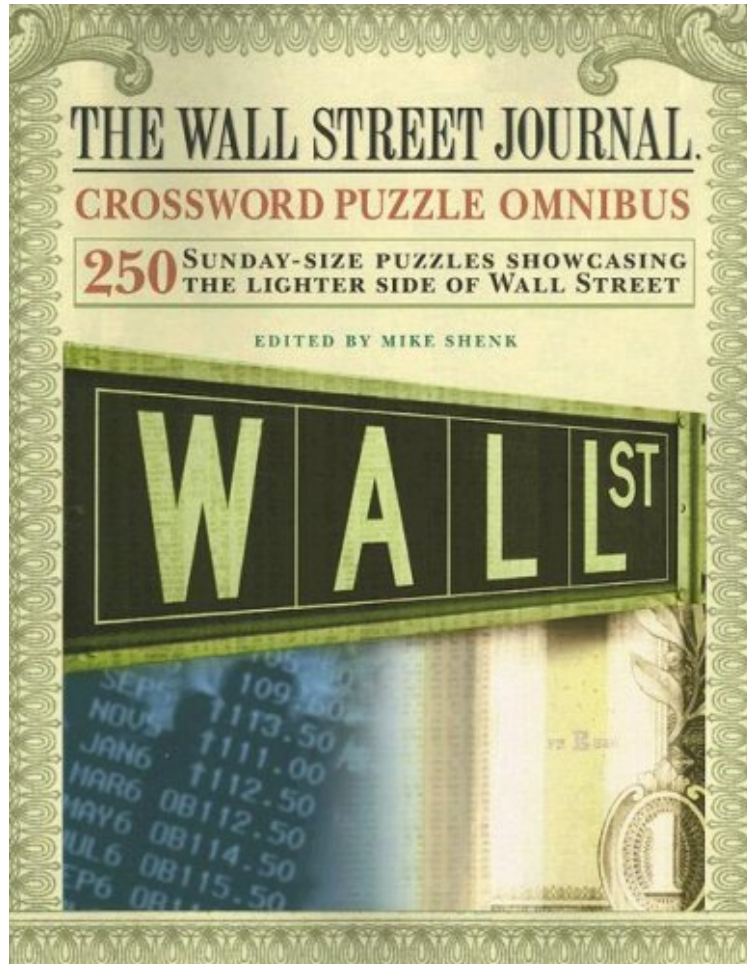

They are the right combination of cleverness without the clues being too obscure. I do have to resort to Internet searches every once in a while, but most of the time I can figure out the entire puzzle if I just have patience. I smile many times when the answers to the clever clues finally become apparent. And when I do have to look something up, I feel like I learned something new, which is never a bad thing. My only complaint--and the reason for the one-star deduction, is that the grid is always at the bottom of the page, which makes it hard to fill in the answers at the bottom of the puzzle. I would prefer that the grid be at the top of the page, like it is in the printed version of the WSJ. I would also prefer a spiral binding, but I just tore off the cover and then tear out the
