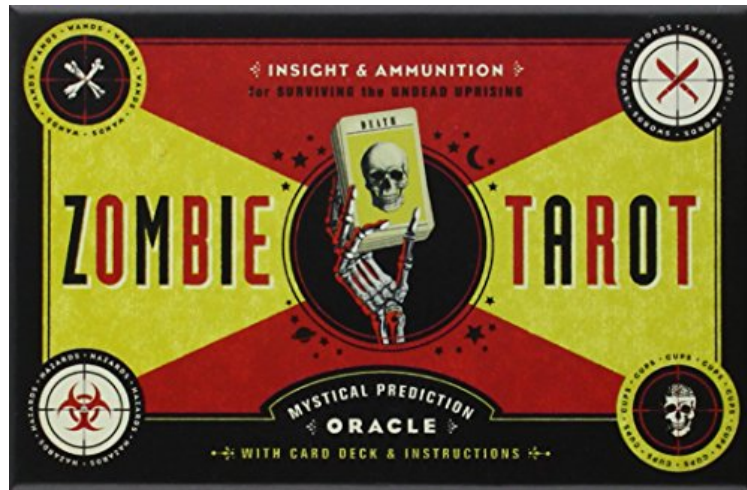

One of the funniest and strangest decks I've come across By Claire Coustier I love to collect tarot and oracle cards, I read them as well, and sometimes for a theme party or event it helps to have a deck that closely matches that theme. The Zombie Tarot is perfect and reads well, beautifully boxed to protect it and the book. The retro illustrations are very creative. Card 13 or Death could be a bit off putting to more sensitive people, but if one stresses that changes are coming that lessens any misunderstood concerns. The spreads outlined in the book are very helpful, and the comments on the various cards are informative and funny, so with a combination of traditional tarot understanding and the Zombie interpretations you have a deck that really presents things to one's current life situation in the 21st century as we are all zombies working to stay alive. The back designs however are not double sided so you can tell from the back side if a card is going to come up reversed. But that really should help the reader prepare for the possible reverse reading. My boyfriend, a retired magician, recognized the image of the swami and said "Poor Alexander, he's getting a beating on this deck", the Swami is a deceased magician called "Alexander, the Man Who Knows"...really that is perfect for a Zombie deck when one thinks about it.
