Well-researched, documents an historic event in rock history By Allan Tong Only 1010 pages long, this book is well-researched and examines in detail the Beatles' last concert in San Francisco in 1966. It interviews witnesses such as Joan Baez, her sister Mimi, promoters, and Rolling Stone magazine co-founder Ralph Gleason. The book reprints various newspaper reviews of the concert, both pro and con. It also offers a run-up to the last gig with an overview of the stormy tour where Lennon's infamous "bigger than Jesus" remark overshadowed the music. The book may offer too much detail for the casual Beatles fan, but is just right for Beatles' scholars, collectors and freaks. Many black-and-white photos, some I've never seen, adorn almost every page. Simply but effectively laid out. (I also recommend Barry Tashian's "Ticket To Ride" which chronicles the entire 1966 tour. By Hiredlenz I recently bought a used copy of this book and I am trying to get some info on it, maybe someone out there can help? The copy I got is signed by photographer Jim Marshall to a Bob McClay. The inscription says, "For Bob McClay who was there, Jim Marshall". Then on the inside back cover there are two what seem to be passes (silks). One that says, "KYA Presents The Beatles" and has the name Bob McClay printed on it. The second pass says, "MEDIA : KYA Presents The Beatles" and in blue pen is written "I Was There". I am trying to get some info on this book and would appreciate anything anyone could tell me. The book itself is

wonderful. The photos by Mr. Marshall are amazing as is all of his work. I am glad I got to purchase a signed copy of this book as we lost Jim Marshall a few weeks ago. If you are a fan of Jim Marshall or The Beatles, this book is something you should own.

Back in print for the first time in fifteen years, "Tomorrow Never Knows: The Beatles Last Concert" (Retrofuture Products) features the stunning images of noted music photographer Jim Marshall. On August 29, 1966, Marshall was granted an unprecedented opportunity to document the Beatles third and last visit to San Francisco. No one, except the group and a few trusted insiders, knew this would be the last concert. Marshall took full advantage of his backstage and onstage access and, with his trusty Leica in tow, captured the four Beatles relaxing, smiling, posing for photographs and finally performing. Author Eric Lefcowitz ("The Monkees Tale") researched the circumstances surrounding the Beatles tumultuous last tour of America, interviewing Joan Baez and her sister Mimi Faria, who were invited guests, Vern Miller who played in the warm up band the Remains, soundman Mort Feld and several other witnesses to the event. Several fascinating articles by noted journalist Ralph J. Gleason are also reprinted. This softcover 104-page edition is available in a limited run.
